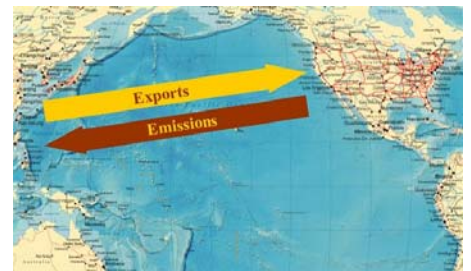
## Whose Carbon Is It, Anyway?
